## 1 big thing: FMCSA Reopens Speed Limiter Rule



**The big picture**: FMCSA is once again considering a rule that would mandate speed limiters on commercial trucks.

- The <u>latest proposal</u> seeks additional information about whether trucks with an electric engine control unit should be restricted to certain speeds.
- FMCSA's previous proposal in 2016 suggested 60, 65, or 68 MPH

**The bottom line:** OOIDA is unequivocally opposed to any action that would mandate speed limiters.

- Studies and research have proven that traffic is safest when all vehicles travel at the same relative speed.
- **By the numbers:** The frequency of interactions with other vehicles increases 227% when a vehicle travels 10-mph below the speed of traffic.

What they're saying: The three top concerns for OOIDA members are:

- 1. lack of passing speed,
- 2. increased congestion, and
- 3. being rear-ended.

**OOIDA** opposes speed limiters because they decrease safety. There is no clean and substantial evidence that supports the use of speed limiters.

# 2. Trendlines: National spot rates for van, flatbed, reefer

**The bottom line:** *May 2-9.* Capacity continues to ease as spot rates have now dropped \$0.73 per mile since the start of the year.

- Last week's national average is still \$0.47 per mile higher than the average pre-pandemic years going back to 2016,
- but that's little consolation for those carriers paying record-high retail diesel prices.

## 4. Education: Getting your own authority, Form 2290



**The big picture:** Taking that next step to get your own authority is a big decision.

• While it opens the door for more income and opportunities, it also presents a greater risk for potential failure.

**Bottom line:** Getting your own authority is a big risk, as 25% of new trucking companies fail within their first year.

• The 2290 Form, is a federal highway use tax paid to the IRS each year. To avoid penalties, and to be able to register your truck at the DMV, you must pay your road tax.

## 5. Diesel Prices



**Big picture:** *May 8.* Diesel prices were up for the sixth time in eight weeks according to the Energy Information Administration's most recent report.

- Week-to-week: the national average price per gallon of diesel is now \$5.623, up from \$5.509 last week.
- That national average is \$2.437 higher than it was one year ago.

**By the numbers:** This week's lowest average price per gallon is \$5.339 (Gulf Coast), and the highest is \$6.461 (California).

• The East Coast, New England, and Central Atlantic regions all increased by more than 20 cents.
