



Thank you for your interest in our Mary Johnston Scholarship Program.

The OOIDA Scholarship Fund was established in 1998 for the children, grandchildren and legal dependents of OOIDA Members. To be eligible, the applicant must be at least a high school senior and no older than 22 years of age. Five scholarships are given each year: one \$2,000 scholarship and four \$1,000 scholarships.

Each student must submit an application, 500-word essay on the topics indicated on the application, and a high school transcript or transcript from an institution of higher learning. The application, essay and transcript are forwarded to the OOIDA Scholarship Committee, which is appointed by the OOIDA Board. The Scholarship Committee reads each essay, reviews all information provided by each student and votes to choose the scholarship winners.

Winners will be notified by letter after our Spring Board Meeting each year. OOIDA will verify enrollment and deposit the funds directly in the student's account at the institute of higher learning of his/her choice. Funds will be available in the first week of August for each year. Each scholarship award is renewable for three additional years. In order to renew the scholarship, the student must complete and return a renewal form that will be mailed to the winners each year.

The Scholarship program is administered by OOIDA Foundation, Inc., which is a nonprofit organization whose purpose is to provide educational materials and conduct in-depth research into issues that affect truckers. Please find the enclosed scholarship application. All applications must be postmarked by **February 1**.
