
# 1 big thing: Monthly Trucking Market Update May



**The big picture**: The Institute for Supply Management's (ISM) Manufacturing PMI is a diffusion index measuring ten leading indicators for manufacturing, including new orders, production, backlogs, inventories, etc.

**1 big thing:** Any number below 50 is indicates contraction, while any number above 50 indicates expansion.

**Why it matters:** The ISM Manufacturing PMI is a reliable economic indicator and provides a sense of direction for the trucking market as shown in the chart.

The bottom line: The new orders index is contracting at a faster rate, the customers' inventories is 'too high', and the backlog of orders index is

dropping to a level not seen since the Great Recession according to ISM.


**The big picture**: Total world trade, which comprises nearly half of the global economic activity and is figured by adding exports and imports together, reached \$39.7 trillion in 2018. This includes machinery and electronics, fuels, metals, vegetables, food products, and other items. More than ever this data suggests that we live in a global economy.

## 5. Diesel Prices

### **On-Highway Diesel Fuel Prices**



**What's new:** *June 19.* The average retail price for diesel increased a little over a penny per gallon compared to last week according to the Energy Information Administration's most recent report.

- Week-to-week: the national average price per gallon of diesel is now \$3.815, up 0.021 cents from last week.
- That national average is \$1.995 lower than it was one year ago.
- This week's largest change occurred in the Gulf Coast region where prices increased a \$0.043 from \$3.489 to \$3.532.
